She completed her LPC at the University of Law, having graduated from the University of Oxford with a degree in jurisprudence in 2020.

However back in 2014, as a Ladies' College sixth form student, Laura actually took part in the Collas Crill Moot. She would highly recommend taking part in the competition - see what she had to say below.

How did your experience of the Collas Crill Moot affect your career choice?

I first started seriously considering pursuing a career in law when I took part in the CC Moot whilst in Sixth Form at Ladies' College but I never would have imagined that I'd be working at Collas Crill seven years later!

It was a fiercely fought contest in my year, and although my team didn't make the final, my fellow team member and I would still both say that we took so much from it – in fact both of us are currently pursuing a career in law so we must have done something right.

What did you take away from the experience?

I can honestly say that at the time you don't even realise all the things you're learning - comprehension skills, working collaboratively, putting together a strong argument, time management, presenting that argument persuasively and confidently, staying calm under pressure – but you'll look back and realise how much you took away from just an hour or two a week.

In particular, it's a really brilliant way to practice public speaking in a supportive environment, and that experience is invaluable at university and beyond, no matter what subject you study or job you end up going into. I know I definitely had an advantage when we mooted at university, just from having that bit of practice already.

What would you say to students considering taking part?

It's such a great opportunity to be able to take part in something like the Moot whilst still at school – not many people outside of Guernsey get the chance to 'try out' being a lawyer like this – and I would recommend it to any students who are even remotely considering it.

In a nutshell, it's fun, brilliant experience, looks great on your CV and gives you something to talk about at interviews (and I promise the judges aren't actually scary!)
